This has been an extremely busy term for fundraising and, as always, pupils and staff from Leehurst Swan have been generous with time, effort and money. The school charity for this year is SSAFA, which supports soldier, sailors, airmen and their families.

The Harvest collection was a great success which provided two boxes of food for the Trussell Trust, the remainder being sold in aid of the Jo Benson Daycare Centre. This centre is run entirely on charitable giving and our help is always greatly appreciated. This was the 39th year that the school had been present at the sale.

Soon after the Harvest collection we collected shoe boxes for the Trussell Trust to send to Bulgaria. At the time of writing we have collected 86 shoe boxes which is our best total to date. In addition to all the above, forms have been having cake sales etc. to raise additional funds, some of which are listed below.

Scholarship and Entrance Examination for September 2010

Entrance and Scholarship examinations for entry to the Senior School in September 2010 will take place on 16th January. For entry into Year 7 the examination will consist of papers in English, Maths and Science. Academic Scholarships are available for up to 100% of the full fees on a means tested basis. Parents must apply for these Scholarships using the forms available from the Bursar. They are awarded on the performance in the Entrance Examination. All applications for means tested scholarships should be received on or before the 16th January. Also available are scholarships in Music, Art and Sport. If you would like your child to sit the entrance examination or be considered for a scholarship please contact Mrs Beverley Smith, Registrar, who will provide you with the necessary form for completion.

Academic scholarships are also available for children entering Year 3 in September 2010, which will be based on examination results. The children will be tested in both literacy and numeracy.
